What is this product?

Type This product is a non-UCITS investment fund.

Strategy The investment objective of the product is to generate long term capital growth primarily through investment in global equity and bond markets. The product seeks to attain its objective by investing in a number of collective investment schemes that best fit the desired exposure and investment strategy.

Intended Investor This product is best suited for investors who are seeking capital growth and are willing to tolerate the volatility levels of the equity markets in the value of their investment. Investors should preferably have a time horizon of at least five years.

Maturity This product is open ended.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years. The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact the capacity for you to receive a positive return on your investment.

The following are some of the other risks materially relevant to the PRIIPs which are not taken into account in the summary risk indicator:
